The summer holidays are just around the corner – and so is Scandlines' absolute peak season. As the school holidays begin, so does the great summer journey, and Scandlines expects to welcome almost 3 million passengers on board during June, July and August. That's almost half of the total number of passengers in a year.

Last summer, over 2.7 million holidaymakers travelled with Scandlines, and this year promises to be just as busy. Already in early summer, many people have secured tickets for the popular routes between Germany and Denmark – and with good reason!

"We look forward to once again being the departure point for thousands of holidays. The summer will be busy – and the ferries will be full of happy travellers. We recommend booking well in advance, especially if you want to travel on weekends," says Lars Kyrø, SVP Head of B-t-C Passengers at Scandlines.

Scandlines expects more than 100,000 passengers to travel between Germany and Denmark on the last weekend in June alone, and the busiest weekends are expected to be the last two in July, when many passengers start and end their holidays. The ferry operator expects to carry up to 150,000 passengers in just three days.

So book now if you want to take one of these attractive departures!

And remember - start your holiday stress-free: leave well in advance; there may also be a queue down the E47/E55 motorway.

- In July 2024 alone, there were 1.2 million passengers (Puttgarden-Rødby and Rostock-Gedser)
